### ATTRACTIONS

Home of the rare Red Kite-their winter feeding farm is nearby at Tregaron a rare spectacle where up to 30 rare wild Kites can be seen. Cardigan Bay is an outstanding and internationally important area for marine wildlife. Designated a Special Area of Conservation, it was the UK's first Marine Heritage Coast, sheltering some of Britain's rarest birds and marine species. Home to a resident population of some 130 bottlenose dolphins, porpoise and grey seals. Boat trips offering marvellous opportunities to enjoy the bay's wildlife are available, especially from New Quay and Aberaeron.

### DIRECTIONS

#### From Aberystwyth

Take the A487 towards Llanrhystud. Turn left on the B4337. Pass Fantasy Farm and Churchfields nursery. Turn left into lane opposite Dewi Sant, the Tin Church, (4 miles from Llanrhystud). We are 100 yards down on the right hand side.

#### From Aberaeron

Take the A487 to Aberarth, turn right on to the B4577. Turn left at Cross Inn to the B4337, through Nebo, turn right at the Dewi Sant, the Tin Church, we are 100 yards down on the right hand side.

#### From Lampeter

Take the A482 and turn right on the B4337. Pass Cross Inn through Nebo for 1 mile, turn right at the Dewi Sant, the Tin Church, we are 100 yards down on the right hand side.
